First Reading:

Jeremiah 31:7-9

Theme: I will comfort the blind and the lame as I lead them back.

The Lord says this: Shout with joy for Jacob! Hail the chief of nations! Proclaim! Praise! Shout: The Lord has saved his people, the remnant of Israel! See, I will bring them back from the land of the North and gather them from the far ends of earth; all of them: the blind and the lame, women with child, women in labour: a great company returning here. They had left in tears, I will comfort them as I lead them back; I will guide them to streams of water, by a smooth path where they will not stumble. For I am a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my first-born son.

Second Reading:

Hebrews 5:1-6

Theme: You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever.

Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; and so he can sympathise with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too lives in the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by God, as Aaron was. Nor did Christ give himself the glory of becoming high priest, but he had it from the one who said to him: You are my son, today I have become your father, and in another text: You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever.

Gospel Reading:

Mark 10:46-52

Theme: Master, let me see again.

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said, 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him, 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.

Pilgrimage to Rome and Assisi—2nd to 7th September 2019 The details for the pilgrimage have been sent though and sign up sheets are available at the back of the Church. We have provisionally booked 40 places (thinking positively) which will be advertised across the four parishes covered by Mgr Tom and Fr Neil. Return flight to Rome. Two nights hotel accommodation in Assisi (daily breakfast and dinner) with visits to Basilica of St Clare, Basilica of the Porziuncola and tour of the medieval town. Three nights hotel accommodation in Rome (daily breakfast) with visits to the four major Basilicas, Mass in the Vatican Grottos and a Papal Audience if Pope Francis is in town. The cost is £715 per person based on two people sharing. If you prefer a room on your own the cost is £890.

Peoples Ponderings:

As some of you will know, I was not able to make it on retreat last week due to back problems. I have been struggling for the past few months and have tried the chiropractor and now tablets from the doctor. Hopefully this weekend you will see me again. The pain has not completely gone, and I may well have to go back to see the Doctor again. I am grateful for the kind wishes and offers of help during the past few days, it was very much appreciated. I hope to get the back problem sorted asap! What did become clear is that we will have to put in place an emergency Mass timetable for weekends, if myself or Mgr. Tom are not well. This would mean in an emergency only one Mass would be said in each parish. In the coming weeks we will try to come up with an emergency plan. An example of a possible solution would be - evening Mass at St Thomas's Gainsborough, 9am at Holy Souls, 11am at St Bernadette's and a Sunday evening Mass in Crowle. This timetable would only come in to use, if we are unable to find supply - ie. Sudden illness.



Reflection: Our readings this week tell of how God, our loving Father, yearns to save us and restore us. He never abandons us. Just as he restored an exiled people to their homeland, he restores sight and clarity of vision to courageous Bartimaeus.

Anyone who comes to Christ must not delude himself of encountering a comfortable life and trouble-free. The experience of Bartimaeus teaches that the journey that awaits those who have received the light is very difficult; it forces us to rethink habits, behaviour and friendships. This week we might ask: What needs restoring in my life? Where do I need to take courage and respond to God's call to me?
