31st Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

First Reading

Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Theme: Listen, Israel: You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart.

Moses said to the people: If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow. Listen, Israel: The Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.

Second Reading

Hebrews 7:23-28

Theme: Because he remains for ever, Christ can never lose his priesthood.

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him. To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Gospel Reading

Mark 12:28-34

Theme: This is the first commandment. The second is like it.

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.

Extract from Pope Francis' Tuesday morning's homily:

Hope is living for the encounter with Jesus: Hope, he said, is not something abstract. Hope instead means living in expectation of the concrete encounter with Jesus. And wisdom consists in being able to rejoice in the "little encounters of the life with Jesus."

If you hope, you'll never be disappointed: Faith, hope, and charity are one gift. Faith and charity are easy to understand. "But what is hope?" the Pope asked. It is hoping for heaven, hoping to encounter the Saints, eternal happiness. "But what," he asked, "is heaven for you?"

Living in hope is journeying towards a reward, yes, toward a happiness that we do not have but we will have there. It is a difficult virtue to understand. It is a humble virtue, very humble. It is a virtue that never disappoints: if you hope, you will never be disappointed. Never, never. It is also a concrete virtue. "But how can it be concrete," [you ask,] "if I don't know heaven, or what awaits me there?" Hope, our inheritance which is hope directed towards something, is not an idea, it is not being in a good place... no. It is an encounter. Jesus always emphasizes this part of hope, this living in expectation, encountering."

In conclusion, Pope Francis emphasized once more that the word "identity" refers to our having been made one community; and the inheritance is the strength of the Holy Spirit that "carries us forward with hope." He called on those present to ask themselves how they live out their identity as Christians, whether they are expecting an inheritance in heaven that is somewhat abstract - or whether they are really hoping for an encounter with the Lord.

Peoples Ponderings:

Incredibly we find ourselves in the month of November. During this month, the Church invites us to pray for those who have died, to assist them on their journey to heaven. Praying for the dead is an important part of our Catholic faith and reminds us how our loved ones are still connected to us.

During this month the names of your loved ones will be placed before the altar with Masses celebrated during the month and throughout the year for the repose of their souls.

Masses can be requested during the year, for those who have died, those who are sick or for a special occasion. The recommended offering is £10 but please don't let this suggested offering put you off requesting a Mass! It is an offering towards the upkeep of your priest and not buying a Mass, so give what you can. **Fr. Neil**



Reflection: When we think of how much God has done for us and how much God loves us we are left with only one response, praise and gratitude and love of God. It is part of our very being, to praise and thank and love God. If we forget in the midst of all our activity how important we are in the eyes of God, what a great loss we have suffered. Think of what he has done for us. He gave us the gift of life itself; he forgives our sins, and he gives us the greatest gift of all; he freely gives us the life of his only Son for our salvation. When we love God and love our neighbour as ourselves, what happens? We become more like God. We are filled with the light of God.

Lord, help us to truly love you in such a way that we will transmit this love to our brothers and sisters, friends and enemies, and indeed the entire human family. Amen
